NYC Ferry is operated by Hornblower, and is the newest way for New Yorkers to work, live, and play! The ferry service connects four of the five NY boroughs: Manhattan, Brooklyn, Queens, and the Bronx. It does not go to Staten Island since there is already a municipal ferry that goes there.

There are two ticket types available for purchase, single-ride or 30-day passes. There are also ticket options for bikes if you will be bringing one on board. All transfers within the NYC Ferry system are free and valid for 90 minutes once you start your one-way trip. Round-trip journeys do not qualify for free transfers.

NYC Ferry offers six routes:

Astoria: Service between Astoria, Roosevelt Island, Long Island City, East 34th St (Midtown East), and Wall St.

East River: Service between East 34th St, Hunters Point South, Greenpoint, North & South Williamsburg, DUMBO, and Wall St.

Lower East Side: Service between Long Island City, East 34th St, Stuyvesant Cove, Corlears Hook, and Wall St

Rockaway: Service between Rockaway, Sunset Park, and Wall St

Soundview: Service between Throgs Neck, Soundview, East 90th St, East 34th St, and Wall St.

South Brooklyn: Service between Bay Ridge, Sunset Park, Red Hook, Atlantic Avenue, DUMBO, and Wall St.
